**ANC 3C Resolution 2026-003**  
**Resolution to Approve a Grant of \$3,733.33 to the**  
**Woodland-Normanstone Neighborhood Association (WNNA)**

**WHEREAS**, Advisory Neighborhood Commission 3C (“ANC3C”) represents the residents of Woodley Park, Cleveland Park, Massachusetts Avenue Heights, and Woodland-Normanstone in Ward 3; and

**WHEREAS**, the Woodland-Normanstone Neighborhood Association (WNNA) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit membership organization that serves residents in the Woodland-Normanstone neighborhood within the ANC 3C area;

**WHEREAS**, WNNA has for many years undertaken community beautification and environmental stewardship projects in the Normanstone Creek Valley and surrounding public spaces, including invasive species removal, tree planting, and forest maintenance;

**WHEREAS**, WNNA has identified approximately 170 trees along Normanstone Drive and Fulton Street with significant vine growth that threatens tree health and increases the risk of tree failure, including past incidents in which vine-compromised trees have fallen into the roadway and caused public safety hazards;

**WHEREAS**, WNNA proposes to retain Shorb Landscaping to perform one-time professional cutting of vines on affected trees, following National Park Service “Weed Warrior” guidelines (cutting at ground level and again approximately five feet above) to kill invasive vines while preserving tree health;

**WHEREAS**, the project area includes public right-of-way and parkland heavily used by residents of ANC 3C for walking, biking, jogging, dog walking, and other recreational purposes;

**WHEREAS**, no District or federal agency currently provides proactive vine removal services in this area, and the Office of Advisory Neighborhood Commissions (OANC) has determined that this grant request is a permissible expenditure of ANC funds under D.C. Official Code § 1-309.13;

**WHEREAS**, the requested grant amount is **\$3,733.33**, to support the one-time professional vine cutting described in the application, and no portion of the grant will be used for overhead costs;

**WHEREAS**, the ANC 3C Community Engagement & Grants Committee considered this application with a presentation from WNNA at its public January 27, 2026 meeting;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED,**

That Advisory Neighborhood Commission 3C approves a grant in the amount of **\$3,733.33** to the Woodland-Normanstone Neighborhood Association for one-time vine removal along Normanstone Drive and Fulton Street, as described in its grant application and supporting materials;

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that WNNA shall comply with all ANC 3C grant guidelines and OANC requirements with respect to expenditure of funds, maintenance of receipts, and submission of required documentation and close-out materials;

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Chair, Treasurer, and the Commissioner for Single Member District 3C07 are authorized to represent the Commission on this matter.
